#### RESIDENTS

Over the span of 2016 - 2021, the greater Downtown Halifax area grew its residential population by 26.1%, making it the fastest growing downtown in the country. 60% of this population are between the ages of 15 and 34.

Downtown Halifax has an employment base of **22,000**.

**4,200** of them are employed directly in ground floor business sectors (food & drink, retail, accommodation and personal services).

The other **18,000** work in an office environment.

#### **DOWNTOWN INVESTMENT**

Now is the time! Downtown Halifax is in a transformation stage with over 24 development projects currently in the works (*including over 1,800 residential units*). In addition to these developments, the Cogswell District is currently under construction. It is the biggest city-building project in Halifax's history.

# Cogswell District: Downtown's Newest Neighbourhood

- \$122.6M in public infrastructure.
- Over 16 acres of road infrastructure converted into mixed-use neighbourhoods.
- High-quality dedicated cycling lanes, multi-use paths, new parks, and open spaces.
- A reimagined transit hub on Barrington Street.
- A significant central urban square that will transform this once trafficcentric area into a livable, pedestrian-friendly area.
- 10,000+ square feet of new commercial ground floor space.
- Residential units that will house 2,500+ people.
